We must move from a care crisis to a stable care system for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD).

The disability service system needs support for:



7.8% Medicaid rate increase



Fair wages for direct support professionals (DSPs)



Capital funding to align with NYS climate goals

WHO WE ARE: NYDA BY THE NUMBERS



NYDA is a statewide coalition of **330** nonprofit disability service providers.



Nonprofit agencies are responsible for **85%** of the supports and services delivered to more than **130,000** New Yorkers with disabilities.

They employ more than **100,000** DSPs and other critical staff at **7,000** locations statewide.

WHY?

Decades of inadequate funding have caused severe staff shortages and left nonprofit provider agencies struggling to maintain facilities and provide the high quality of care that people with disabilities deserve.

Without action, this lack of funding will continue to compromise the long-term sustainability of services for New Yorkers with disabilities.

How to Move From a Care Crisis to a Stable Care System

PROBLEMS	SOLUTIONS
The I/DD service industry is experiencing an unprecedented financial strain caused by Medicaid reimbursement rates that no longer reflect the true cost of care	Invest in I/DD services through a 7.8% Medicaid rate increase to stabilize non-profit provider agencies.
DSP wages are not in line with the level of skill and responsibility necessary to support people with disabilities. Furthermore, there is a great disparity between wages paid by state-operated and nonprofit agencies.	Create a Wage Commission to examine the roles and responsibilities of human service workers and establish fair, sustainable compensation standards commensurate with that work.
Many non-profit provider agencies operate with outdated resources that do not meet New York's ambitious climate goals.	Enhanced Capital Funding to help agencies modernize their operations, making them more energy-efficient and in alignment with the state's climate goals.

Direct Support Professional Wages

DSPs at non-profit providers make significantly less than their counterparts doing the same work at state operated facilities. This inequity further compounds our staffing crisis, and needs to be examined

Average Non-Profit Starting Wage	OPWDD State Operated Starting Wage
Downstate - \$17.23 per hour	Downstate - \$27.97 per hour
Upstate - \$16.74 per hour	Upstate – \$25.36 per hour



We urge you to support these asks and ensure the I/DD service system moves from a **care crisis** to a **stable care system**.
